### **School Uniform**

School uniform is compulsory for all pupils

- A red jumper or cardigan (this can be with or without the school's logo on it)
   for Reception to Year 4
- A black jumper or cardigan (this can be with or without the school's logo on it) for Year 5 & Year 6
- A white polo shirt or white collared shirt
- Grey or black trousers/skirts/dresses
- Grey or black tights with skirts and dresses
- Red gingham summer dresses for the girls in summer
- Grey or black smart shorts for boys in summer
- PE Kit: This can be a plain white T-Shirt (Branded T-Shirts are available in school), a pair of grey or black shorts / leggings / tracksuit bottoms & black gym pumps or trainers.
- Swimming: Suitable swim trunks / shorts (+ swim t-shirt if preferred) for boys.
   Full body swimming costume ( or swim shorts and swim t-shirt) for girls.
   Bikinis and Tankinis are not allowed. Goggles & Swim hats at parents discretion

We STRONGLY recommend that you put your child's name in their uniform and talk to them about how to be responsible for it. Footwear should be black, safe, weather appropriate and sensible. High heels and back-less shoes are NOT permitted for safety reasons



# **Clothing**

Please ensure your child has a coat at all times as children play outside everyday. In cold weather they will need a hat, scarf and gloves. In warm weather they will need a sun hat.

- Children need to wear sensible shoes, NOT sandals.
- Please write your child's name on ALL clothing. Jewellery (with the exception of studded earrings) is NOT permitted.
- Children should have sensible hair styles and should not have inappropriately coloured hair or unusual haircuts.
- Headwear such as headbands can be worn but must be in the school colours.

#### **Assemblies**

Children attend three school assemblies throughout the week plus our Friday celebration assembly on the last Friday of the month. Assemblies are always an extension to the learning that takes place within the classroom and are generally based around our school values.

#### **Snacks**

Acorn Class: Milk is free for under 5's, over 5's can be provided at a small cost (please register with Cool Milk for either free or paid milk at ). Fruit is provided for free under a government scheme for Reception to Year 2 children.

Saplings & Oak Classes: Milk can be provided at a small cost by <u>Cool Milk</u>
Snacks are permitted at break time. Please ensure they are of a healthy variety
(no chocolates / sweets are permitted– also nuts must not be bought onto the premises under any circumstance)

# **Parking**

The car park is for staff only. Please ensure you park your car away from the school premises and not on the cobbles or yellow lines. This is for the continued safety of the children.

# **Our Building and Grounds**

We are extremely proud of our school building and grounds and are constantly thinking of ways to improve the provision for all pupils.



#### **Forest School**

Heptonstall is delighted to be able to offer a Forest School on Friday Mornings; funded by Heptonstall PFA and run by Oaks Apple Forest School. Your Class Teacher will be in contact regarding the clothes children must bring and when they will participating.



#### **Extra-curricular Activities**

Heptonstall also provides opportunities for a range of educational trips and visits throughout the year and pupils can take part in various residential experiences.

Heptonstall is committed to developing the talents of its pupils in a wide range of areas and we encourage pupils to take part in our extra-curricular activities such as Art Club, Mindfulness Moments Club, Board Games Club and Choir.

The Family of Learning Trust has a Sports and Health Coordinator who organises inter school competitions.

Children have the opportunity to join club activities at lunchtimes and after school. For after school activities parental permission is needed. Parents will be informed of the after school clubs available for pupils to participate in on a half termly basis.

#### **Breakfast Club**

We run a Breakfast Club on Mondays, Tuesday & Wednesdays 7.30am to 8:45am. The cost is £4 per morning. Toast is provided. Please contact the School Office to register your child(ren).


#### **Homework**

The school believes that homework is an essential part of pupil progress. Parents are provided with a half termly information sheet explaining what children are learning in school and how they can be supported at home.

Children will be asked to undertake various tasks according to their age. Remember to talk to your child each day about what they have been doing in school.

- Read at home each evening.
- Learn spellings for a weekly Spelling Test.
- Learn Rapid Recall of additions up to 10 and 20, Number Bonds and multiplication tables.
- Complete a weekly Maths task.
- Complete occasional research which will link to their creative curriculum topic.

Sapling & Oak Class children who struggle to fit homework in during the week at home can complete it on Friday afternoons by attending our afternoon homework club.





#### **Attendance**

School starts at 8.45am and this is when the doors open.

Attendance is monitored on a daily basis and we take swift action when we are concerned. We are here to help any family who may need support in getting children to school.

#### Entry & Exit to the school

#### **ENTRY INTO SCHOOL**

All Children enter School through the Glass Corridors.

Children in both Key Stages are allowed to come quietly into school between 8.45am and 8.55am. Teachers will be present in their classrooms from this time.

Attendance is monitored on a daily basis and we take swift action where we are concerned. We are here to help any family who may need support in getting children to school.

#### LEAVING SCHOOL AT THE END OF THE DAY

Children exit from the same door as above. Children in Oak and Sapling Classes MUST be handed over to parents. Children in Oak Class will be allowed to leave unaccompanied if their parents have sent in a letter to allow them to do so.

Please ensure your child knows who is collecting them each evening.

Please be prompt at the end of day! If for whatever reason you know you are going to be a few minutes late (e.g. stuck in traffic) then please endeavour to contact the school ASAP so we can make sure your child is informed and looked after – a few minutes not knowing can seem a lifetime to a young child!



# **Dinner/Packed Lunch Arrangements**

We buy our school meals from Scour Road Academy. There is a varied and balanced menu.

There is a choice of meals each day and special dietary needs can be catered for.

Pupils are encouraged to drink water only during the school day. There is a water in each classroom. They should not bring juice other than for having with a packed lunch.

If you wish your child to have a school meal, they are £2.60 per day/£13.00 per week and this amount is to be paid via Online Banking wherever possible. Please contact the school office for the bank details.

The school dinner menu for the week can be found on our <u>website</u>. Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to free school meals as part of the governments universal infant free school meal scheme. #### **Parents and School**

We are committed to working in partnership with parents and carers to ensure that all pupils reach their potential. We have a firm, fair and consistent policy for rewards and behaviour which ensures that all children feel safe, respected and valued and receive recognition for their many successes.

Our staff and Governors are dedicated and caring and the 'Open Door' policy of the school means there will always be a senior member of staff available to discuss any problems or issues you have.

Parents are invited to attend Parents' Evenings giving them the chance to meet their child's class teacher and to discuss their child's progress. Three evenings are held for each class throughout the year. Parents receive an annual report about their child/children. These are sent to parents in July and an opportunity is then given for parents to meet the class teacher to discuss the report.

We use an app in school to communicate with parents called Dojo. This is very easy to download onto your phone and allows you to not only be able to see the wonderful work your child is doing and comment on it but it also means you can message your child's teacher directly.
