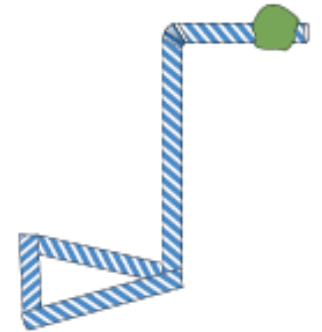
A **structure** is something that is built to do a job.



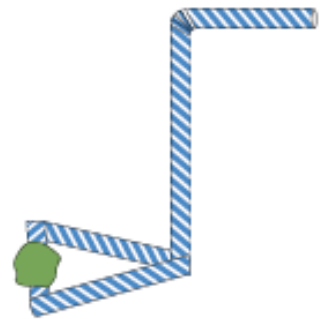
Structures with a **narrow** base are **unstable**.
