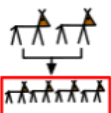

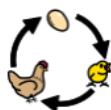

Offspring that has not reached adulthood.

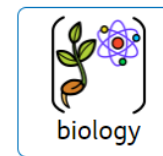
Adult



When an animal or human become fully grown.

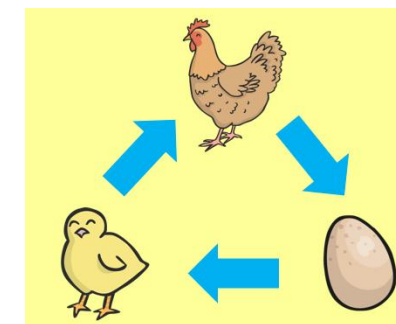

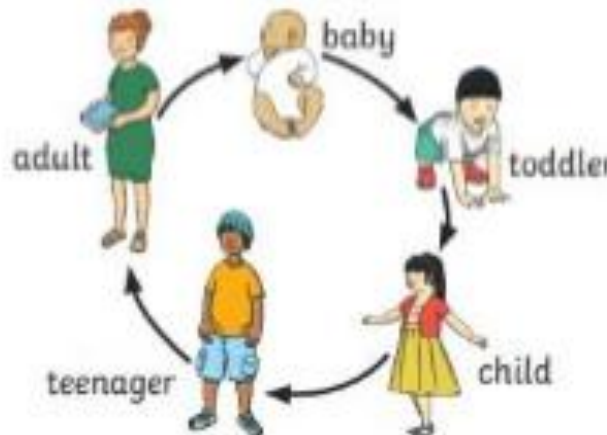

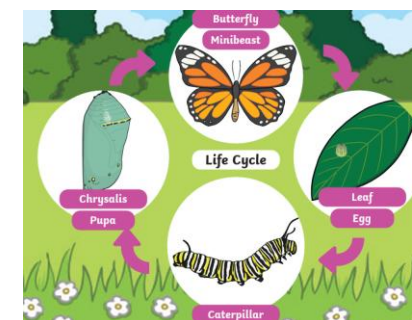
Life Cycle of a Hen

Life Cycle of a Butterfly





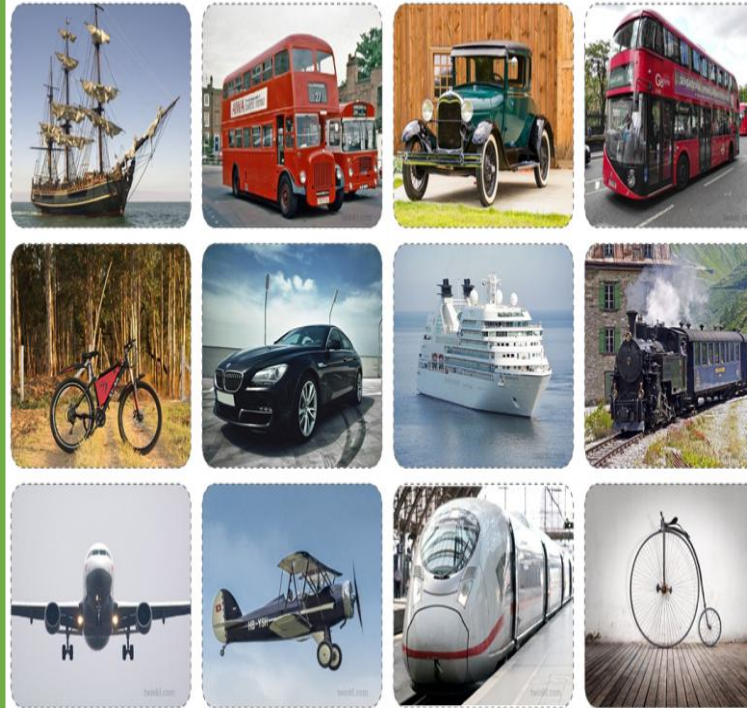

Amelia Earhart was a brave pilot from the 1930s who loved flying. She became famous for being the first woman to fly alone across the Atlantic Ocean.

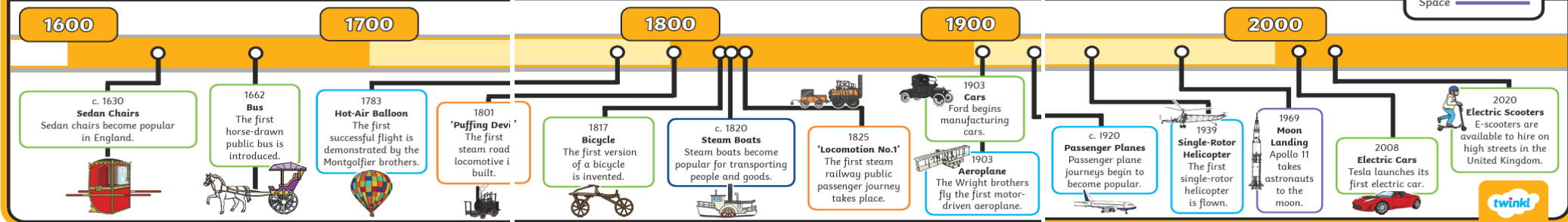


Travel and Transport Timeline

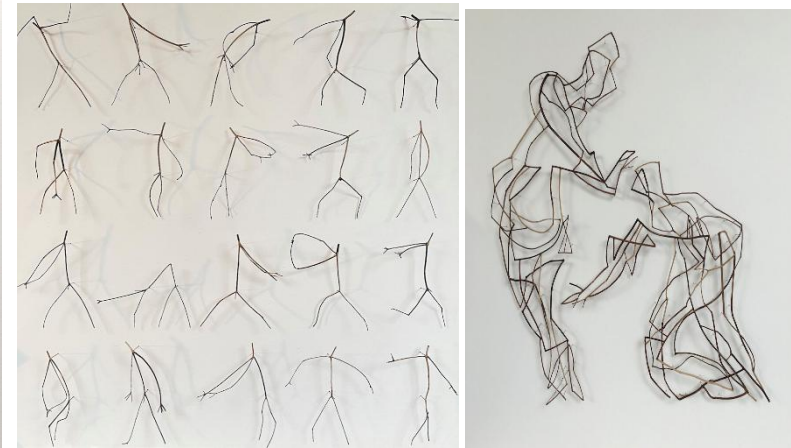

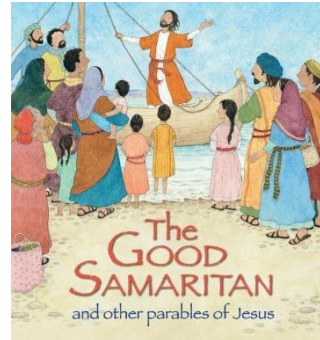
 caring	Displaying kindness and concern for others.

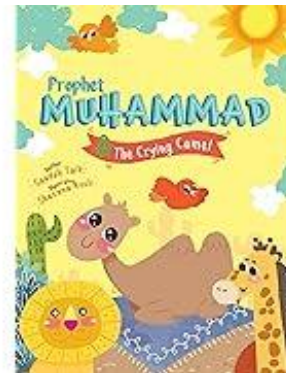

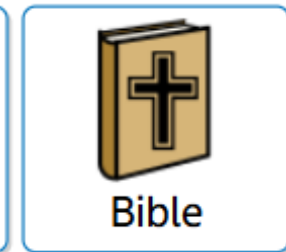
